

"Herself" is the brainchild of Tim McGillicuddy '84, and is the 25th year anniversary production of the theatre company The Drilling Company, which is also the producer of Shakespeare in the Parking Lot and Shakespeare in Bryant Park. The play premiered in late March and will run through April 20 at A.R.T's Gural Theater in New York City.

The play is already receiving some critical acclaim, including through a review by <u>Woman Around Town</u>. The author Alix Cohen writes, "This is the kind of play you might assume rendered by Brian Friel – not a comparison of style, but rather one of nuanced character depiction, relatable situation and solid storytelling. Five Men's Lacrosse Players and Coach Smith Named All-Conference and Coach of the Year award

Five Saint Michael's College men's lacrosse players were named Northeast-10 Conference All-Conference on Monday, when two first-years landed on the NE10 All-Rookie Team and seventh-year head coach <u>Alex Smith</u> garnered NE10 Coach of the Year accolades.

Senior <u>Nathan Woods</u> (Ottawa, Ontario/Kent School) and junior <u>Sebastian Simonson</u> (Spruce Grove, Alberta/Spruce Grove Composite) were the Purple Knights' initial first team selections since 2007, senior <u>Cam Steuer</u> (Saratoga Springs, N.Y./Saratoga Springs) and junior <u>Sean Regan</u> (Pittsford, N.Y./Pittsford Sutherland) earned spots on the second team, and graduate student <u>Alex Chirqwin</u> (Queensbury, N.Y./Queensbury) was named to the third team. First-years <u>Thomas</u> <u>Cahill</u> (Georgetown, Mass./Georgetown) and <u>Taylor Wiercinski</u> (Groton, Mass./Lawrence Academy) claimed positions on the NE10 All-Rookie Team.
