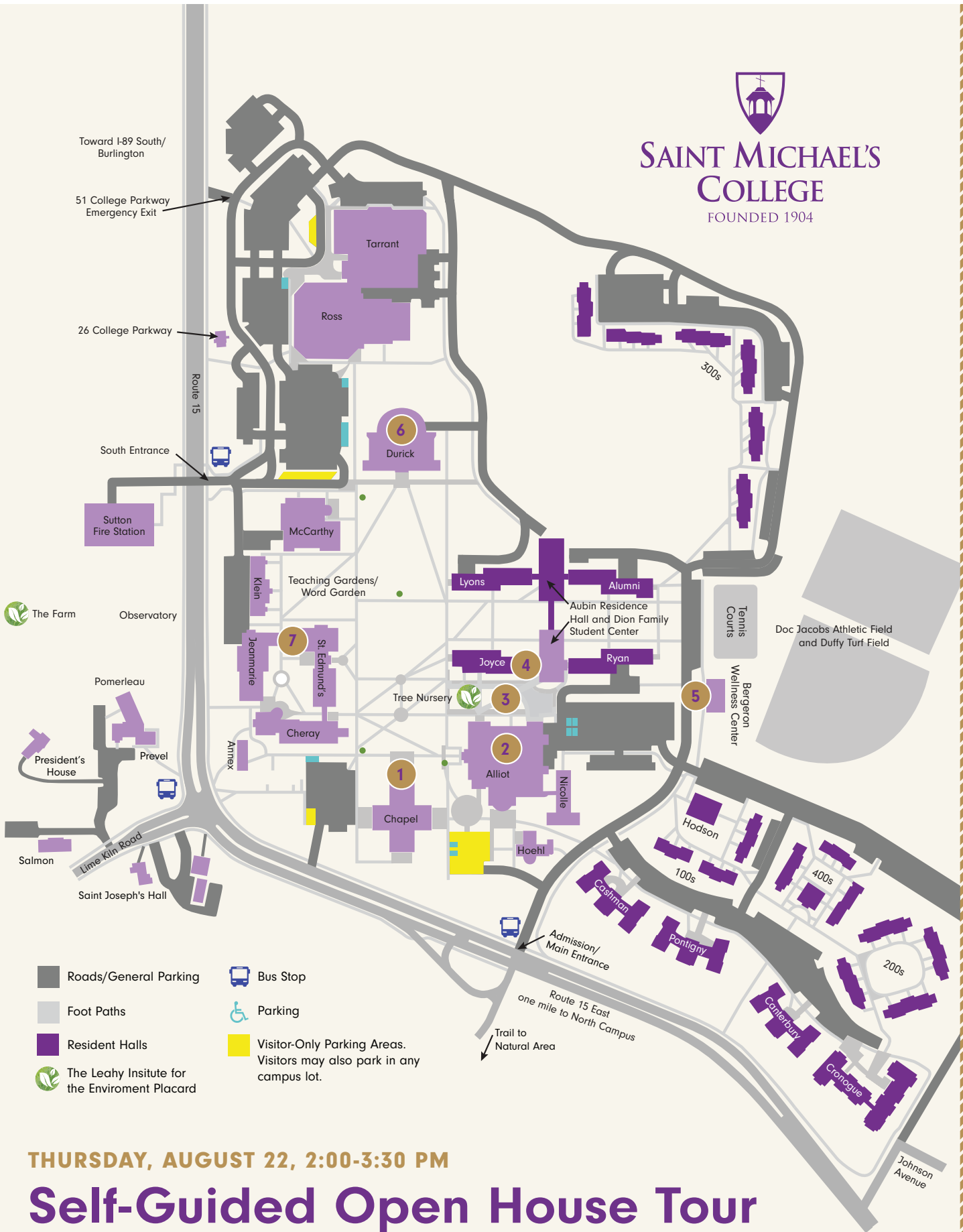

### (1) Chapel of Saint Michael the Archangel:

**Edmundite Campus Ministry** offers spiritual opportunities through the celebration of Mass, Liturgical Ensemble, Liturgical Singers, Table Fellowship, retreat experiences, faith sharing, Scripture reflection, and opportunities to deepen one's own personal faith life. As a Catholic college, we are founded and rooted in the Roman Catholic tradition, but we invite and welcome students of all faiths and backgrounds.

### (2) Alliot 1st Floor:

**Mobilization of Volunteer Efforts (MOVE)** connects students to meaningful community service opportunities locally and nationally. MOVE has a focus on service, justice, spirituality, and leadership and offers one time, short term, and longer term opportunities to match a variety of interests and passions.

**Be Well** engages students in holistic wellness exploration through activities, events, and education, all while having fun and creating a culture of wellness here at SMC.

#### Alliot 2nd Floor:

**Alliot 204: The THRIVE@SMC** pantry is a place to go, without judgment or payment, that is easily accessible and fills community needs for fresh produce (from the SMC Farm), non-perishable foods, personal hygiene products, cookbooks, nutrition guidance, cooking supplies, and culturally-inclusive foods (from our Raised Bed Gardens).

**Alliot 223: Center for Student Diversity, Empowerment, and Community (D.E.C.)** All students and families are invited to the Center for Student Diversity, Empowerment, and Community to meet staff, tour the space, learn about programs and services, and to learn how to get involved in culturally affiliated student organizations.

### (3) Joyce Hall/Alliot Courtyard:

**The Patrick '61 and Marcelle Leahy Institute for the Environment** is the hub for environmental programming at SMC. Through our place-based education and experiential learning opportunities, we strive to develop environmentally-conscious citizens that leave SMC with essential workforce skills and purpose, and prepared to tackle the world's most complex issues—locally and globally.

**The Institute for Global Engagement** serves as the collaborative hub of international activity at SMC, promoting global learning and literacy, deepening inter-cultural competency and inclusion, and supporting opportunities for global engagement.

### (4) Joyce:

**Joyce 150:** The **Office of Purposeful Learning** and our Success Advisors are here to support students and encourage their engagement on campus and in our community. We offer an Introduction to Purposeful Learning course to help first-year students in the transition to college and introduce resources and opportunities that will transform and engage them at SMC and beyond.

**Joyce 108:** The **Military Community Services** Our office is dedicated to the attainment of personal, educational, and professional goals of the members of the military community. Whether you are a current or transitioning service member, Veteran, or dependent of a service member, we are here to assist you on your journey.

**(5) Bergeron Wellness Center:** is where students can go for medical and mental health services. Our staff works as a team to provide confidential integrated care for our diverse student body.

### (6) Durick Library:

**Main Floor: Durick Library** supports research and scholarship by students, faculty, and staff at SMC. Our librarians provide expert research assistance, both on campus and remotely. The library offers diverse collections in multiple formats and a variety of comfortable study spaces for students.

**Main Floor: The Writing Center** offers individual support to any student who wants feedback on a writing assignment, from research papers to resumes. The Center is staffed by trained student coaches across majors. Coaches can help you take your work to the next level!

**Upper Floor: Peer Tutoring** Saint Mikes provides free peer tutoring for most subject areas. These sessions are offered by our highly trained and qualified tutors in both individual and group settings.

**Upper Floor: The Office of Accessibility** is devoted to ensuring equal educational opportunities and a responsive campus environment for students with disabilities. The Director, Mary Wright, promotes self-awareness for students with disabilities by educating them about their rights so that they can independently advocate and make choices to meet or exceed the academic standards expected of them.

**Upper Floor: Beyond Access** There are different pathways to success in our Beyond Access program available to students who may want to enhance their executive functioning skills (Academic Skills Coaching with Kevin Sedlak), those who want to partner with a social coach in navigating the social curriculum (Social Coaching and Consultation for Neurodivergent Students with Stan Baker and Gigi Weisman), and those interested in honing their college-level reading and writing skills (Strategic Reading and Writing Coaching with Toni Messuri).

### (7) Boucher Career Education Center:

**St. Edmund's Hall. Rooms 126-133:** We believe it is essential for students to have access to quality, real-world experiences through internships, on-campus student employment, and volunteering. At the Boucher Career Education Center we are here to guide your path, providing support to students choosing a major, information on building your résumé and networking, career advice, and assisting with internship and job searching.
