# Statement of Purpose for Graduate School

Your statement of purpose (SOP) is your opportunity to **tell the admissions officer what the <u>other</u> parts of your application can't**.

It's how you can express who you are in your own voice, with a selection of illuminating experiences.

It tells the reader who you are and who you can and will become as a result of graduate school.

#### **Understand the Goal:**

- **Know what the program wants:** Each program has its specific prompt or focus. Read it carefully and tailor your SOP to address those points.
- **Showcase your passion and fit:** Demonstrate your genuine interest in the field and how your background aligns with the program's research or focus areas.

## **Crafting Your Content:**

- Start strong: Hook the reader with an engaging introduction that your passion and interests.
- **Highlight your experience:** Briefly summarize your academic background, research experience (if any), and relevant work experiences that showcase your skills and preparedness for graduate studies.
- **Focus on research interests:** Clearly articulate your research interests and how they align with the program's faculty expertise or research areas. Show your understanding of current research trends.
- **Future goals:** Discuss your long-term career goals and how this graduate program will equip you to achieve them.
- **Be specific:** Use specific examples and achievements to illustrate your points. Personalize your writing and avoid generic statements.
- **Program fit:** Show why this specific program is the ideal fit for you. Mention faculty members you'd like to work with (if applicable) and how their research aligns with your interests.

# **Writing Mechanics:**

- Clarity and conciseness: Write clearly, concisely, and professionally. Avoid jargon.
- Active voice: Use the active voice to demonstrate your initiative around your experiences.
- Proofread meticulously: Ensure your SOP is free of grammatical errors, typos, and formatting issues.

### **Additional Tips:**

- **Get feedback:** Ask your career coach, professors, advisors, family, and/or mentors to review your SOP and provide constructive criticism.
- Adhere to guidelines: Follow the program's specific instructions regarding length, formatting, and submission requirements.
- Start early: Give yourself ample time to revise and refine your work.
