


Join the SMCRFC for an Alumni BBQ & Touch Rugby Game!

No. 2 Men's Ice Hockey Defeats No. 1 Saint Anselm for NE10 Postseason Crown

The Saint Michael's College men's ice hockey team clinched the Northeast-10 Conference Championship on March 1, 2025, with a decisive 5-1 victory over top-seeded Saint Anselm College. Senior defenseman David Ciancio led the charge, scoring two goals and assisting on another, earning him the tournament's Most Valuable Player honors. This triumph marks the Purple Knights' sixth NE10 postseason title and their first since 2009. The team concluded the season with 18 wins, the second-highest total in program history, showcasing their defensive strength by leading the league with a 2.40 goals-against average and a .929 save percentage.

Starting on 3/24/25 you can register to become a CSA member by visiting the Farm's Instagram (<u>@farm.smcvt</u>) and clicking the "Faculty, Staff, & Alumni CSA Registration Form" linked in our bio OR by emailing Farm and Food Program Manager, Christine Gall at <u>cgall@scmvt.edu</u>

Shares can be purchased in denominations of \$400, \$300, \$200, or \$150 and are good for the duration of the CSA season, which runs from mid-April through late October. Purple Knights in the Community


